In the mountains of Harz National Park, hike fabled (or better put, bewitched) forests or chug through by steam-powered railway. Barnim Nature Park features top-notch cycling paths, castle ruins, swimming lakes and an abundance of wildlife, including wild Konik horses. TREK TRAVEL TOUR DE EDANCE

An official tour operator of the Tour de France, Trek Travel provides an in-depth and behind-the-scenes experience of professional cycling's most exalted event. 

BRYCE CANYON NATIONAL PARK

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Summer is an especially educational time to visit Bryce Canyon National Park in Utah. Mark your calendar for the 16th annual Astronomy Festival, June 1-4, which will feature astronomy presentations, workshops and constellation tours in one of America's darkest and most stargazing-friendly locales. Or if rocks are your passion, attend the seventh annual GeoFest, July 15-17, for special programming related to the park's earth-based wonders.

Bryce Canyon National Park has the largest collection of hoodoos—pillars of rock strangely shaped by erosion over the ages—in the world. Take in the stunning panoramas from a scenic viewpoint, or delve deeper into the park's treasure-filled interior with a hike or a wrangler-led trip by horse or mule. nps.gov/brca
